We have an open door policy and always welcome your comments, questions, or suggestions


What we ask from families......



## CHILD DROP OFF & PICK UP POLICY

#### Drop Off:

- The center's doors open at 7:50 am; Morning class begins at 8:00 a.m. For afternoon classes, the center doors open at 11:20 am.
- Getting your child to school on time, gives them time to ease into their school routine daily. This is very important for young children.



- Children must be signed in to their classroom with a full signature & time.
- Please help your child to use the restroom, wash hands, and get started with an activity.

#### Pick Up:

- classes end at 3:30 p.m Children must be picked up on time every day. Half-day morning classrooms end at 12:00 p.m. Full-day and half-day afternoon
- Children must be signed out of their classroom with a full signature & time.
- If you have made different pick up arrangements, please let your child's teacher and the front desk know at drop off. Only authorized persons and must be done PRIOR to others picking up your child. Identification will be requested if the person is not known to the staff. may pick up children. Please be sure to add any individuals who may be picking up to your child's contact list. This can be done at the front desk
- If a child is not picked up on time, the following protocol is followed:
- Within 10 minutes, staff will call guardians. AGAIN, IT IS VERY IMPORTANT TO HAVE CURRENT CONTACT PHONE NUMBERS!
- If staff is unable to reach you, we will continue to call the listed contacts on file. If we are not able to reach someone to pick up your child within 30 minutes of pick up time, the police will be notified.

#### Car Seat Safety

Road injuries are the leading cause of unintentional deaths to children in the United States.

Never let your child ride in a car unless secured in an ageappropriate car seat! Correctly used child safety seats can reduce the risk of death by as much as 71 percent

#### Medical Health Care

The physical and emotional well-being of your child is very important to us. Our program requires that each child has the following:

- Physical exam
- Up to date immunizations
- Hearing, vision and developmental screening
- Lead and hemoglobin testing

#### **Attendance**



Attendance is recorded daily and is checked by the program staff as required by our regulations. If a child is absent for an extended length of time or attendance is irregular, the Family Services Coordinator will contact you in order to discuss ways to improve attendance.

## Exclusion Policy - Children will be excluded from attendance at SECC if:

- The child's illness prevents the child from participating in routine activities.
- Keeping the child in school poses an increased risk of illness to the child or to other children or adults with whom the child will come into contact.
- throat, upper respiratory infection, diarrhea, vomiting, impetigo, untreated lice, ring worm, pink eye with pus coming from the eye, severe coughing. The child exhibits any of the following symptoms, which require immediate attention: fever, rash, abdominal pain, unusually irritable behavior, sore or red

### Conditions that DO NOT require exclusion:

- A type of germ in the child's bowel movement or urine that can cause disease, but without symptoms
- Children with conjunctivitis with clear watery discharge and no fever, eye pain, or eye or eyelid redness
- Children with a rash, but no fever or change in behavior
- Mild respiratory illness that poses no risk to others

## ADMINISTRATION OF MEDICATION

Medication will not be given without a signed medical authorization for the particular prescription or non-prescription medication.

Non-prescription medications must be accompanied by written authorization from your child's physician, along with instructions for Please do not give your child medications that they are to administer themselves while at school, such as cough drops, creams, or pills, etc.

The Head Start approach to school readiness means that children are ready for school, families are ready to support their children's learning and schools are ready for children.

with parents to To support you as your child's first and most important teacher, the family services coordinator, Sheri Johnson-Horsley, will partner

- Support families in reaching their goals via Family Partnership Agreements (FPA's.) FPA's identify the strengths & resources of each Head Start family in the program and are designed to support families in meeting their goals. Families are asked to meet twice a year with the family services staff.
- Encourage family involvement in your child's education via being a classroom volunteer, being an educator at home attending activities to support parenting (i.e. participating in weekly parenting classes, to build resilience in your children & (supporting your kids at home with what the teachers are doing in the classroom), being a member of our governing board and
- Provide information on resources in the community that strengthen your child or the family
- Plan and organize family activities/events and home based socializations.
- Promote literacy via lending library, story time with guest readers and reading initiatives like Literacy month in November.
- Work with community agencies (i.e. Solvista Health, Family Youth Initiative, Chaffee County Health, etc.,) to align programs which help support our families' needs




#### The Power of Outdoor Play

- Studies show that fresh air can reduce the spread of colds and germs.
- The USDA recommends children move at least 60 minutes each day, and 30 minutes for adults.
- Fall and winter play presents wonderful opportunities for children to observe and collect leaves and pinecones, make footprints and build things out of leaves and snow.
- At home, you can feed the birds by hanging apples, popcorn strings or pinecones rolled in peanut butter.
- Go for a nature walk, go sledding, or shovel and dig in the snow.

**Teachers** encourage children to learn by exploring and participating in hands-on activities. They provide a variety of activities and experiences, encourages children to play with peers and support individual skill development for all children.

**Home Visitors** visit weekly with families and support healthy attachment, parenting strategies and child development information. Family events provide opportunites to meet with community and peer groups.

We are very proud of our education staff. Each year we provide on-going training to help staff maintain skills, enthusiasm, and knowledge.

#### **Families**

We work hard to engage families as we care for and teach their young children. We do this by asking for family input about our program, goals for your child and ways we can provide support to families. We meet with families on a regular basis including family partnership meeting, conferences, home visits and at pick up/drop off.

A child's first educational experiences set a foundation for a lifetime of learning. We call this **school readiness**, the hope that every child will succeed in future school experiences. Research shows that when children's families and schools work together children are more successful! We encourage families to share their culture and background with our classrooms.

## A child's play is their WORK!

**CURRICULUM** We follow the *Creative Curriculum* which helps teachers to arrange the environment, set a schedule, plan activities, deliver instruction and make daily interactions so that each child is challenged based on their own individual development. The curriculum has four main developmental areas; *language*, *physical*, *cognitive* and *social/emotional* skills. The goals and objectives tie directly to Colorado standards for Kindergarten readiness.

We want children to become curious thinkers and learners We value your **input** and encourage you to share ideas and activities with us.

During your child's time here at SECC there are likely to be a few changes.

Family transitions: We have many resources to support those tricky little life changes like the birth of a new baby, potty training or even divorce. Please let us know if you are interested in any of these resources.

School transitions: We will work with you to plan for changes here at school too. When a child leaves one classroom to move to another we begin thinking about and planning with you far in advance to make the move as smooth as possible.



### Social Emotional Health of Children

According to Kristin Stanberry, to understand social and emotional development in preschoolers it is recommended to practice and reinforce the following skills with your child throughout the day, to further your child's development:

- Provide structure and daily routines at home; this creates a secure environment for your child.
- Encourage your child's independence. As he practices and masters skills such as getting dressed, brushing his teeth, or feeding a pet, be sure to praise him.
- Make sure your child has regular social contact with other children his age, both one-on-one and in a group. This is an opportunity for you to teach him to cooperate with peers, resolve conflicts, and build and maintain friendships.
- Play games that require your child to cooperate with others, wait his turn, and learn to be a gracious winner or loser.

All families will receive notice of next year's placement in May.



- All licensed Centers are legally obligated to report child abuse/neglect.
- Our Program acts as an advocate for families by referring them for assistance.
- The Salida Early Childhood Center works with other community agencies to best help families
- The Salida Early Childhood Center offers parenting classes, workshops and various other resources to strengthen families.

## Families can also support this effort by doing any of the following:

- Increase their sensitivity to what and how children express themselves
- Become knowledgeable about early childhood development and child care programs
- Form relationships with other families who have children of the same age
- Understand and use child abuse reporting procedures when appropriate.
- Communicate with the staff and director if you have any questions or concerns
- Our open door policy encourages families to speak to us freely about these issue as well as any others!


### Parent Participation and Volunteer Opportunities:

#### How to Prepare Your Child For Kindergarten

Have you signed your child up for kindergarten? If he or she will be 5 years old by August 1st of this year, your child will be ready to enter Elementary School!

There will be Transition Activities scheduled in May for you & your child to become familiar with the kindergarten program at Longfellow Elementary School. Please check your child's cubby for information on these activities to ease your transition to public school.

Some things you can do to help your child get ready are:

- Visit Longfellow Elementary during transition events. Your child will feel more secure if he or she sees the classroom, playground and school as a whole.
- Show him or her where the water fountains & bathrooms are, and where to put his or her coat and backpack.
- Use the materials given to you by the preschool and kindergarten teachers to keep your child's skills up during the summer.
- Lastly, be sure to visit the school during the summer. Play on the playground with your child & check out the lush gardens and the free "lending library". Take a book, give a book.
- Show your child that school is a FUN place to learn and grow!
